## *IO1 State of the Art*

Health issues are established among vulnerable groups due to low levels of health literacy. Digital health literacy (DHL) among vulnerable groups is low compared to the one of the general population. Barriers contributing to low levels of DHL vary among the vulnerable groups and are mostly relevant to both individual background and health system context. Improvement of DHL levels will empower individuals among vulnerable groups. Exploiting the drivers facilitating the delivery of DHL and existing tools will help to develop strategies for enhancing their DHL levels. Healthcare professionals should deepen their knowledge and the ways of the information delivery across the vulnerable groups by using easily accessible and user-friendly DHL tools.

## *IO2 Digital Context & Components*

CSICY as the leading partner of this output is currently working on the development of an e-learning platform and mobile application that will host the modules created by partners on the following topics:

## *IO3: Methodological Framework Handbook*

Outlook: Currently we are working on the IO3. This should be a guideline for all products developed in the project. Stakeholders should receive a guideline for the implementation of the training activities in their facility.

For this purpose, addressees (adult educators, health care, staff with knowledge about the target group, etc.) are currently being identified in order to be able to adapt the content to their different needs and possibilities. The manual will be available as a digital and interactive flipbook.

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
